	off. Distribution is done on a volunteer basis, and it is administrative free. Would	
	use school ambassadors and the meals come labelled, and they are picked up	
	and dropped off to the classes.	
•	Every meal provides 50 cents to the schools and 20 cents to local nutrition	
	programs. Meals are equally priced ranging from \$3.50 to \$8.25. Food for Good	
	is being used in several DPCDSB schools.	
•	The meals that are available include: Gino's Pizza – boneless wings, veggies,	
	small nuggets, apples and so on. BarBurrito's has quesadilla and tacos. Have	
	vegetarian, beans and brown rice burritos, but no vegan or gluten free options.	
•	If any issues with order, then admin will be contacted, and arrangements will be	
	made for delivery of the meal.	
•	Payment: can be pay as you go or pay for all at the same time. Only requirement	
	is that there are at least 50 orders per school. There are delivery fees as initially
