Faith Formation:

Forming ourselves in our Catholic faith is a foundational element in helping each of us understand and live in the example of Christ.

Faith formation is a process of journeying into a deeper relationship with Jesus. Its primary points of reference are our own lives and the Bible. Through them we come to know Jesus most profoundly and we are shaped as a biblical people. Within the community of St. Joachim School, the mission of staff, students and parents is to respect and accept the uniqueness of each individual as a follower of Jesus. All members are encouraged to realize their full potential spiritually, academically, emotionally, socially, and physically. The Catholic School Improvement Learning Cycle for St. Joachim School focuses on faith formation through the lens of providing "connections to scripture" for the well-being and mental health of all community members. In addition, we strive to achieve a positive climate that is tempered by an "awareness of practices that support and honour the many cultures, needs and voices of our diverse groups". Through this focus on faith formation we aim to create a healthy social space that includes student voice, staff voice and community representation; a place where all learners feel safe, involved and supported. Students, staff and families are included in:

- Organization of monthly liturgies for all students
- School wide celebration of Mass
- Special Intentions of all members of our school community in our Morning Prayers

- Weekly Lenten Dedications

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

Aligned with our Virtues Program, once a month, one grade level will organize a celebration of the virtue of the month. These monthly assemblies highlight how students can positively interact with each other in the classroom, hallways and outside at recess. Morning announcements and the virtue wall serve as reminders of the need to look for the actions we are practicing.
